

Questions on Chapter 3: Candide's Escape from the Bulgarians

- 1. What was the preacher like in Holland? What kinds of things did he say?
- 2. Who helped Candide finally? Who did not help? What was the religion of each?
- 3. How might this story be a criticism of Christianity? Would that be dangerous?

Questions on Chapter 4: How Candide Found Pangloss Again

- 1. What happened to Cunegonde and her family?
- 2. What disease does Pangloss contract? Trace the "genealogy" of this disease.
- 3. Did this "genealogy" break the rules of this society?

Discussion 2:

Questions on Chapter 16: 2 Travelers, 2 Women, and 2 Monkeys

- 1. Describe **in detail** what the lost travelers hear and actually see
- 2. What do the travelers do about it, and what is the reaction of the women?
- 3. What do they find out afterwards was actually happening before?
- 4. What could be the meaning of this story, according to Cacambo? What do you think Voltaire could be up to here? Was it a dangerous message?

Questions on Chapters 17 and 18: Eldorado in the Eyes of Europeans

1. Who are the "villagers?" What do the travelers believe they have found?



- 2. Describe the old man's house, and what Eldoradans are like
- 3. What is their religion? Do they have priests, monks, many gods? Why not?
- 4. Describe the way these people worship. Would Europeans be surprised?
- 5. What do they ask about meeting the King, and what is actually the custom when meeting him? Would this surprise them?
- 6. Is there Science in Eldorado? Describe it.
- 7. What is amazing about the King? Although a monarchy, is Eldorado a "tyranny?"
- 8. As you see it, how is Eldorado in stark contrast to 18th century Europe?


Discussion 3:
